







PUBLIC ROBBERIES-WEAPON TIME OF DAY































COMMUNITY POLICING BUREAU 2017 Calls for Service per Beat





PRIORITY 1 RESPONSE TIMES


CALL RECEIVED to OFFICER ARRIVED 2015-2016-2017 Comparison













Year Over Year Live Release Rate (LRR) Comparison






Year Over Year Euthanized and Died-In-Care Comparison

GANG INTERDICTION Convicted

- >14 years Gun charges, gun sales to undercover officers and gang enhancements
- >4 years Accessory to murder, attempted burglary and gang enhancements
- >21 years Robbery and assault with a firearm
- >50 to life Murder with gang enhancements
- >50 to life Murder with gang enhancements
- >27 years Murder, home invasion robbery and gang enhancements
- >4 years Home invasion robbery and gang enhancements
- >22 years Attempted murder with gang enhancements
- >9 ½ years (CYA) Assault with a deadly weapon
- >7 years (CYA) Attempted murder with gang enhancements
